**Important Information Regarding Your Schedule**

The schedule you received is the best combination of core courses (those you must take) and the elective courses you have chosen.

If you received an elective course that you did not choose, it is either because that elective did not fit in your schedule (based on the other core courses you chose) or, you did not select enough credits during registration in the spring, thus another course(s) was added.

Due to the size and complexity of the school schedule, La Salle cannot entertain, nor honor requests for specific class periods, lunch times, or teachers.

**Students seeking to make additions or changes to their schedule can do so during the Add/Drop period. This begins the first day of classes and ends the last day of the 1<sup>st</sup> cycle.**

Both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester schedule changes need to occur during the Add/Drop period in the fall.
